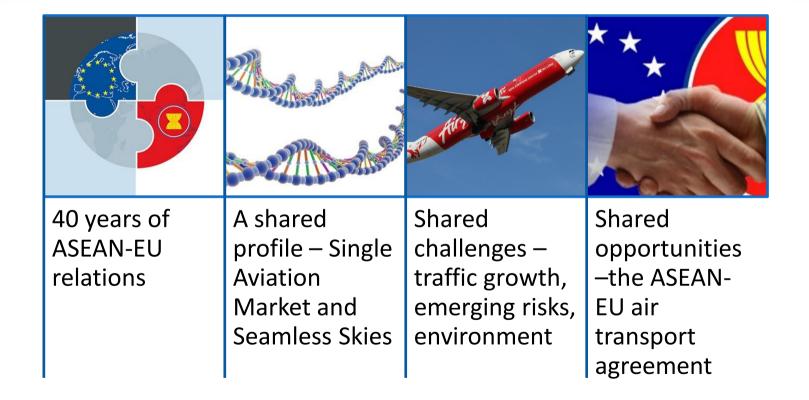

### The EU aviation safety system

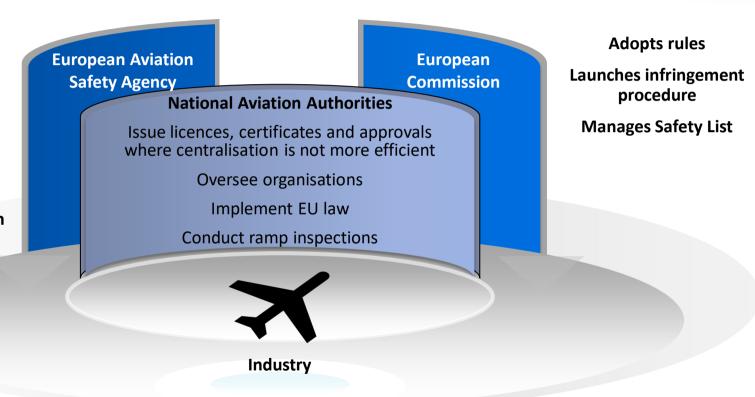

## Advantages of regional integration



#### **Airlines**

- Increased safety and interoperability
- •Lower costs (training and hiring of personnel across the region)
- Move beyond third, fourth and fifth freedom rights
- In the future, seamless airspace -> reduced fuel consumption and
   reduced emissions



#### **Authorities**

- Harmonisation and ability to pool resources and safety/security information
- Greater cost efficiency through mutual recognition and economies of scale
- Greater capacity to address cross-border challenges



#### **Passengers**

- Safer travel
- Lower prices
- Improved connectivity



#### **Governments**

- Enhanced policy dialogue
- Linked regions and communities
- Improved contribution to tourism, trade, investment and service flows



#### **Partners**

- Efficient delivery

- Politically more neutral





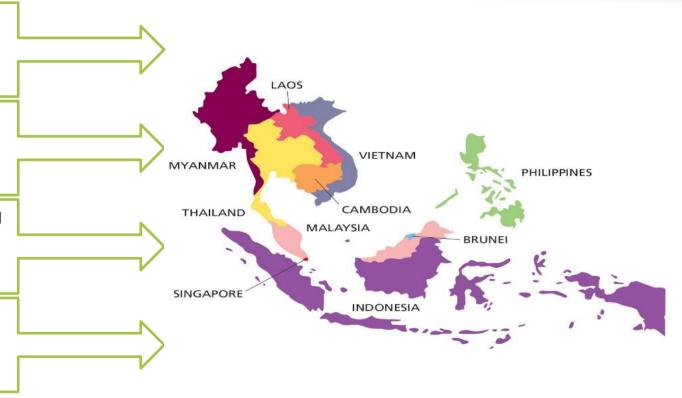
### South East Asia - context

Air Traffic growth of 6.6% per annum over next 20 years

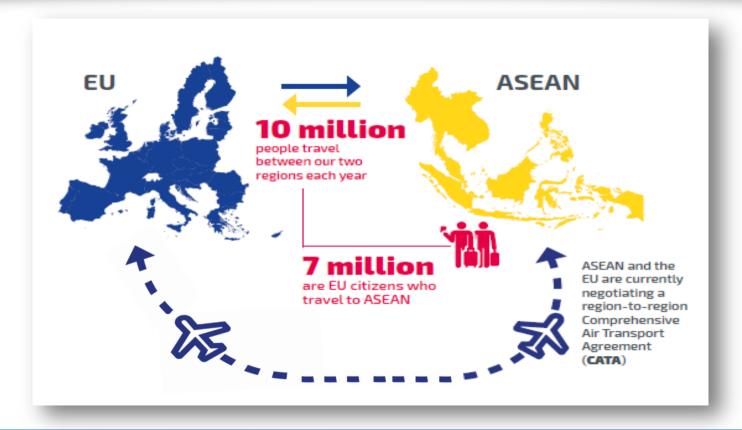

## An evolving document significantly updated every 3 years

#### A Master Plan should contain:

- ✓ Performance objectives (The Why)
- Description and prioritisation of technical and operational solutions (The What)
- Deployment scenarios per stakeholders (The Where and When)
- ✓ Investment needs and performance gains over time (The How Much)
- ✓ Standardisation and regulatory views,
   Risk Management Plan (The How)







### What is the European ATM Master Plan?



- Provides a clear and future-proof vision for the finalisation of the SESAR project as a whole, towards a "digital European sky" (2040)
- Addresses integration of all air vehicles, manned and unmanned, civil and military, in all airspaces, controlled or not (first reference to U-space)
- Integrates results and recommendations of the Airspace
   Architecture Study (AAS) addressing the "capacity crunch" and is
   aligned with key Wise Persons Group's findings and
   recommendations
- Combines improvements linked to airspace optimisation and reconfiguration and technological solutions (AAS)
- Synchronised with EASA's European Plan for Aviation Safety (EPAS)



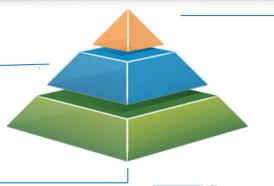
## The 3 levels of the Master Plan: a tool for States and stakeholders

## Level 2 | Development View (yearly update)

Contains plan & architecture for SESAR Development activities

## Level 3 | Deployment View (yearly update)

Plan and report on implementation of SFSAR activities

Also drives ATM changes in relation to EASA Rulemaking plan, Network Strategy Plan, Deployment Programme, standards (EUROCAE Work

Programme)



The MP is the basis for annual planning and progress monitoring, it should be used by Member States when developing their performance plans



#### Linking to ICAO, feeding a global agenda

- ✓ The MP is linked to, and aligned with, the GANP and helps align and shape the global aviation agenda by ensuring that all EU/ECAC states speak with one voice
- ✓ At last year's ANC, papers on Committee A on Air Navigation and ATM were directly or indirectly related to the Master Plan
- ✓ The MP is also a high interest cooperation area in all bilateral arrangements with FAA, China, Japan, ASEAN...







The MP is the voice and "ambassador" of European ATM on the global scene





### So, why do we need an ATM Master Plan?

- To streamline ASEAN ATM investments
- To avoid fragmentation and duplication in R&D
- To deliver Solutions that meet your future performance needs
- To clearly position ASEAN's ATM in the APAC Regional and worldwide context
